Focus on the Homelessness Helpline - An Interview with Linnea Albrycht



The Homelessness Helpline is a key feature of homelessness prevention in our region. Linnea Albrycht, a Homelessness Helpline Specialist, along with her team, responds to the housing crisis calls that come through the helpline. For every person that calls into the helpline, an assessment is completed that determines the client's unique needs, and then referrals are provided to community resources. "Having our line as the front door for homeless services has decreased client confusion around available services and has streamlined the process for entering shelter," explained Linnea. The numbers speak to the impact of the helpline — in the first six months of the fiscal year, 4,632 homelessness crisis calls were answered quickly and compassionately.

What is the best part of your job?

The best part of my job is being able to watch clients grow. We often encounter people at their lowest points, so seeing clients get connected with services and regain stability for themselves is a great reward.

What is one of the biggest challenges that you face in your job?

The hardest part of my job is that I wish I could do more. Homelessness is a symptom of a system that has made it nearly impossible for many people to flourish and survive. There is a great deal of work that needs to be done at a higher level to tackle the issues that cause homelessness.

What is an interesting thing that others may not know about you?

I think the most interesting thing about me that most people don't know is that I absolutely adore classical music. I play the piano, violin, and sing, and I always try to find time every day to indulge in music as a form of self-care. I also write music in my spare time! I spend at least three hours a day at my piano, playing comfort pieces I've known for years and pushing myself to learn new pieces frequently. For me, music is about emotional exploration and communion; every piece is an honest display of the internal.

What is your motto?

The motto I live by is that we should make it a priority to love others unconditionally. We are all people with hearts and lives, and we all deserve respect. I find it calming to admire others, their journeys, and love them because of who they are.
