Shona's Story -

Shona didn't necessarily enjoy asking for help but a confluence of circumstances -- curveballs that 2020 has been prone to deliver -- put her in a predicament.

Her apartment lease was about to expire, and she was on a waitlist for a new place in Spotsylvania.

Then the pandemic turned everything upside down. Her hours at a daycare where she worked were dramatically cut. She moved into an extended stay motel with her 13-year-old daughter. Unbeknownst to her, she said, the waitlist for the complex where she hoped to move had been frozen.



Life as a single mother, however, prepares you for set-backs, she said.

"You put on your big girl britches and keep moving," she said. "If I cried and fussed over every little bad thing that happened, I'd never get anywhere."

They moved and stayed with her sister for a short time but the "hustle and bustle and carrying on" in DC didn't suit her. Born and raised in Virginia, she was more accustomed to grass and trees than concrete and drama. They moved back home and resumed looking for an apartment without success. Her unemployment benefits were nearing an end.

At the time, Shona was generally aware of Loisann's Hope House. Her mother, she believed, had stayed there briefly years ago and a few mothers of children she had cared for at the daycare had received help.

But her understanding was that Loisann's Hope House was a "battered women's shelter" and she wasn't that, she said.

It took a while to connect, in part, she acknowledged, because of her tendency to screen calls from unfamiliar numbers.

Loisann's Hope House began looking for an apartment and then brought her in as a resident.

It wasn't a completely seamless transition. A private person by nature, she said, she wasn't accustomed to a curfew and other rules. At Loisann's Hope House, however, assistance comes with expectations.

Still, she began to appreciate the Loisann's Hope House community, even if it was sometimes from the sidelines. She enjoyed watching the younger kids running around. "They were so adorable and it was nice meeting new people."

Her daughter also enjoyed the company and interacting with the kids as well.

For the most part, clients don't fully comprehend the reach of the Loisann's Hope House umbrella of supporters and network of providers, she said. They just know that the support is there when they need it. It can be overwhelming and frustrating, she said, reaching out to various support agencies as an individual, not always knowing whom to call and not always getting responses





as quickly as you'd like. But Loisann's Hope House, she noted, always received quick replies from agencies that she had called and left messages.

Shona and her daughter stayed at Loisann's Hope House for three months before, in November, moving into her new apartment, which was completely furnished by Micah Ecumenical Ministries, a nonprofit responsible for coordinating efforts of Fredericksburg church congregations to make a better community and assist people living in the margins.

Shona, meanwhile, is working at a new daycare that gives her more hours. Loisann's Hope House assisted with her rent and security deposit and is providing continued support, both financially and emotionally.

Loisann's Hope House, she said, was there for her when she hit a rough spot and her new roommate, another childcare worker, jokes that she wished she knew about LHH when she was struggling.

For anyone in her situation who doesn't know about Loisann's Hope House and what they can do, "I'd definitely recommend they go over there."
